Level One Reaccreditation Guidelines

Accredited Coaches at all levels of the Tenpin Bowling Australia coaching pathway must be current financial TBA members.

A Tenpin Bowling Australia Coach Registration fee of \$75.00 will apply to coach re-accreditation. The TBA Registration covers a coach for two (2) years with the National Sporting Organisation and includes the following:

- Registration with the NSO for 2 years
- Registration with the Australian Sports Commission National Coach Accreditation Scheme
- 10 million dollars of Public Liability Insurance
- One (1) million dollars of Coach Indemnity Insurance (please refer to the policy document for full insurance policy detail which can be downloaded from the TBA website)
- TBA Coach ID Tag
- Opportunities to coach in TBA Registered Centres and attend Coaching Workshops with the National Coach, Chris Batson and updating workshops organised by your State.
- Dependent on qualifications; the opportunity to Coach Local, State and National Teams.

Level One Tenpin Bowling Coaching Accreditation

Tenpin Bowling Australia Level One Coaching Accreditation is valid for two (2) years

30 points/hours to be completed (1 point = 1 hour)

<i>Attain Level 2 Tenpin Bowling Coaching Accreditation</i>	<i>Meets total requirements</i>
<i>Practical coaching (any level of athlete and competition)</i>	<i>20</i>
<i>Professional Development activities including;</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>State or Nationally approved workshops, camps or seminars</i> - <i>SMA Sports Trainers Course or Senior First-Aid Course</i> 	<i>10 (points/hours can be achieved through one or more professional development activities)</i>

Level One Tenpin Bowling Accredited coaches are required to complete a log book of practical coaching hours completed and to provide evidence of practical coaching and professional development undertaken within the previous 2 years. Up line Coaches or Centre Managers are able to sign log book entries as a witness to practical coaching hours completed.

Other events or activities may be recognised at the discretion of the Tenpin Bowling Australia. Requests for inclusion should be made in writing to the National Coaching Advisory Committee.
