THE OPERATION OF

STATE/TERRITORY/ZONE TEAM

SELECTION COMMITTEES

Committees in the Nation responsible for conducting trials culminating in a team or teams that will represent their State/Territory/Zone in either Rachug, Youth Teams Challenge, National Seniors Team Challenge or President's Shield must follow the following procedures for the conduct of their trials:

- i) apply to TBA for accreditation of the Trials process.
- ii) comply if possible with the procedures that were submitted with the accreditation. There are many things that can change between the creation of the procedures and the actual trials. These changes can be brought about by having to change a venue for whatever reason, insufficient numbers of applicants, clashes with other events etc.
- iii) should for any reason the published procedures not be able to be followed, the CEO must be advised and approve proposed changes before any changes can occur.
- iv) The TBA CEO must be given as much notice as possible of any proposed change and subject to acceptance of the change, will issue written approval for the change.
- v) The TBA CEO may give verbal approval upon short notice, but will follow up with written approval.
- vi) any and all personal details submitted by each applicant must be treated as totally confidential and not disclosed to any other party without the express permission of the TBA CEO.

Non compliance with any of the above may result in that teams expulsion from the event in the following year.

- vii) no Trials will be accredited if they are conducted on the same day as a TBA Ranked Open event.
- viii) The names of all persons involved in the actual selection of team personnel must be made known to those persons competing for the team positions.
- ix) if a State/Territory chooses the “select two bowlers” option, they must make the selection criteria known to competitors prior to qualifying commencing.
